## **Living In A Fog?** by Greg Richardson (contemplativemonk.com)

We live so much of our lives in a fog. All around us, and in our own hearts and minds, there are regrets about the past, fears about the future, thoughts and feelings and other distractions. Each of us struggles to free ourselves from the obstacles and challenges which get in our way.

It is when we stop struggling, stop trying to free ourselves, we begin to become free.

We sit down, settling comfortably into a familiar chair. Our breathing calms down and we begin to breathe

more deeply. Deep, cleansing breaths allow us to rest and expel the tensions and concerns which have been distracting us. Each breath, in and out, helps us pay attention in a new way.

We close our eyes and lose sight of everything pulling at our attention. Closing our eyes allows us to forget about how we look, and stop caring about the appearances of the people around us.

Our cares and concerns begin to fade away. The darkness inside our eyelids becomes a blanket which protects us from everything trying to get us to pay attention.

Sitting still, breathing deeply, closing our eyes, we listen to the stillness within us and all around us. The stillness is sacred because it holds nothing which distracts us from the loving presence of God.

We are open to the presence and action of God, of spiritual life. Beyond struggling, we give our consent to God living in our lives. We do not need to understand or organize all the ways God is alive in us. Spiritual life lives in us, and in the world around us, in more ways than we can imagine.

Listening to sacred stillness gives spiritual life opportunities to come alive in us. In the dark, undistracted stillness God's spiritual life is at work in us, healing and restoring what has been broken. We pray without words, beyond words, as people have prayed for thousands of years.

Part of our contemplative practice of centering prayer is returning to the world in which we live. We do not need to jump up and rush back to our distractions. Taking our time, we gently open our eyes. We continue breathing deeply and sitting comfortably. Gradually we stand and begin again.


