One of the words most commonly used by Our Lord is the simple, lovely word 'Today'.

Tomorrow, yesterday do not concern him. And he does not want them to concern us.

He does not want us to worry about them.

Today's quota of trouble is enough.

But I am sure you know people - or perhaps you are one yourself - who seem to have one foot perched on yesterday, and the other on tomorrow.

Their balance is precarious, naturally.

And they are usually gloomy people, or, at least, harassed, tremendous worriers.

They can't get much done, their nervous energy is so dissipated, a lot of it on yesterday, the rest of it on tomorrow.

But one man who did an awful lot in his lifetime said 'Now is the acceptable time'.

The time to be seized, to be made use of, to be enjoyed is now.

This may seem obvious and easy.

Obvious, possibly; but by no means easy. Not to worry about tomorrow means trusting

someone who will.

And Christ was most insistent that God would look after tomorrow.

You may remember how he drove it home, so simply and so memorably to those humble peasant and fisher folk, many of whom lived at a bare level of subsistence.

He looked at the sky and told them how well God cared for the birds. And, he added, God loves you more

Worry, in other words, is basically a lack of trust; no more. And no less.

It is not virtue to worry. Quite the opposite, it is virtue to trust.

Shakespeare called the night 'the death of each day's life'.

Each day is a kind of life, a pocket edition of life, with a beginning, a middle and an end.

There is a wonderful freshness about the new day. It has life, challenge, opportunity.

Perhaps opportunity is its finest ingredient. You may say, 'but my life is so dull'. Every day is the same yesterday, today, tomorrow. Forget about yesterday, forget about tomorrow. They just don't exist. Just take today.
