Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As Christmas approaches, we reflect on how things have changed in our lives and in our world in the past twelve months. We bring memories good and bad to the table on Christmas Day. At some tables there will be an empty space, with someone having died or someone away from home. At other tables there will be an extra place, welcoming a new member to the family. At other tables there will be a sombre mood, tragedy having struck. The cruel killing of 130 people while enjoying a night out in Paris, from 18 different countries, from all walks of life, by Islamic State terrorists, struck a deep chord of apprehension throughout the world. All the while, Pope Francis is emerging as a remarkable and charismatic world leader in his pursuit of global peace, the healing of divisions and inequalities within the global human family, calling for practical support for refugees, alerting us to the cry of the poor and the cry of the Earth. He reminds us that education in environmental responsibility 'can encourage ways of acting which directly and significantly affect the world around us, such as avoiding the use of plastic and paper, reducing water consumption, separating refuse, cooking only what can reasonably be consumed, showing care for other living beings, using public transport or car-pooling, planting trees, turning off unnecessary lights, or any number of other practices'. The Restoration of the 'Murillo' Painting by Caterina Goodhart

We are gradually paying for the Restoration which took 4 years to complete. The total cost will be ϵ 40,000 approx. The sterling rate has not been favourable! The Murillo Restoration Fund presently stands at ϵ 9,090. Here were the various stages in the restoration process:

Receive and unpack the painting...... Disinfestation of the stretcher.

Removal of the stretcher. Cleaning of the stretcher.

Disinfestation of the canvas.

Removal of the previous relining canvas.

Removal of the previous relining canvas.

Removal of the relining paste.

Removal of the relining paste.

Preparation for relining.

Visit to the reliner to assist and advise.

Return of the painting on the stretcher from the reliner.

Removal of the protection paper. Stage 1 cleaning – removal of dirt.

Stage 2 cleaning – removal of varnishes. Stage 3 cleaning – removal of residual varnish.

Stage 4 cleaning – partial removal of previous restoration.

Visits to the Louvre in Paris, the Prado in Madrid (conservation dept.),

Wallace Collection, Dulwich Picture Gallery.

Cleaning all the areas of paint loss from the binding mixture.

Send samples of paint for analysis – cross sections of paint analysed using a microscope (Visible and UV light, 50x to 500x optical magnification).

Additionally, a selection of samples was analysed with Scanning Electron Microscopy in combination with Energy-dispersive X-Ray spectroscopy.

Working with external technicians to carry out the X-Ray analysis.

Filling all the areas of paint loss with gesso.

Carefully scalpelling all the areas of gesso to match the original paint layers as possible.

Prepare and send for 2nd relining – this was necessary as at the 1st relining the paint

layers were not visible because they were covered by the Japanese paper and very little pressure was used hence the paint layers did not adhere completely.

Adjustment of the gesso and reapplication where necessary.

First retouching with reversible colours which did not work (after 6 weeks of retouching it was necessary to carry out further tests to find colours which were stable and would ultimately match the original colours).

Second retouching with colours which now remained stable.

Extensive base retouching where large sections have been remodelled completely (approximately 30% of the surface).

Application of varnish.

Final retouching on top of the varnish on all the base colours to adjust the colours and toning, aging etc.

Packaging of painting for shipment.

Unpacking and final retouching once in the frame.

The following documents are required to complete this form:

- 1. Baptismal Certificate
- 2. Confirmation Certificate
- 3. Pre-Marriage Course Certificate. (Pre-Marriage Courses: www.accord.ie)
- 4. Letter of Freedom (if necessary)
- 5. Receipt of three month notification from the Civil Registrar of Marriages. (Stranorlar Registrar: Marie Greene on 074 9189554 / 9189558)

Fr Colm will gladly advise couples on the above.

Money Matters

We are sincerely grateful to everyone who supports the parish financially, the general running of the parish and contributing to the Restoration Fund.

- The upkeep and maintenance of the parish, in terms of buildings, programmes and personnel, are carried out in a cost-efficient manner and your ongoing support is vital.
- Our target for all restoration work (including provision of the new Parish Office) is now set at €3.1 million. This includes the restoration painting and current interest on a bank loan of €950,000. Our current monthly repayments are €9738. On 1st December 2015 the loan balance stood at €675,472. We are grateful for your ongoing support.
- Weekly or monthly or annual contributions are very much appreciated. It is also necessary to have a number of fundraising efforts during the year.
- Many people use the weekly envelopes for their contributions. We are
 delivering two sets of envelopes (Parish Envelopes and Restoration
 Envelopes) to each household which has been in receipt of envelopes.
 If you do not intend to use both, discard what you do not need.
 It makes it much easier, for office purposes, to do it this way.
 It means just one delivery of envelopes, with matching numbers.
